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# Addendum 29

- A working group of the SDC 900 reviewed the 27 comments submitted
- Several comments submitted were to strike the sections on creating direct and third-party providers completely
- SDC 900 will request that the Board of Directors revise their original policy on the financial separation of QAD and providers providing rating services

# Policy, Amendments & Implementation

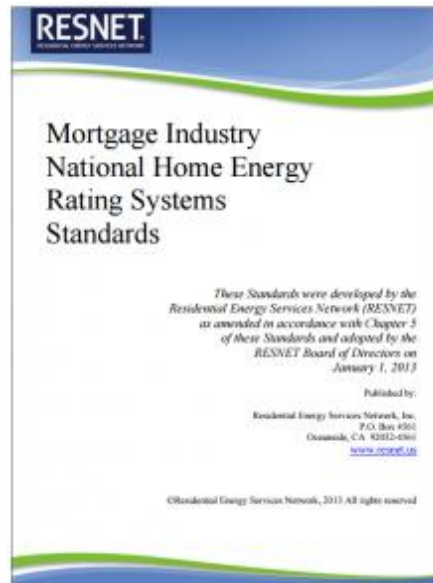
- The RESNET Board approves the policy
- The policies are implemented in the RESNET Standards through amendments
- SDCs review public comments and approve the responses to the comments
- RESNET staff enforce the RESNET Standards



# Addendum 29

Addendum 29 was released for public comment and only included:

- Creation of Direct and Third Party Rating Providers
- Creation of Quality Assurance Agents



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# New Provider Models

## Direct Providers

- Do ratings in-house

## Third-party Providers

- Do not do ratings in-house



# Quality Assurance Agents

Anyone doing quality assurance for RESNET will become “Agents of RESNET” and will be trained.



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# Why a smaller QA Amendment?

- Changes were lost in the larger amendment
- Help facilitate the consideration and adoption

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# What was the reason for making these changes?

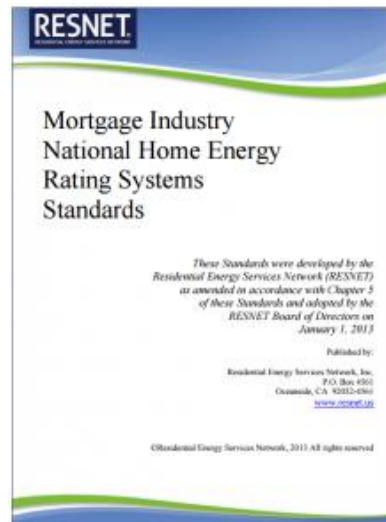
## RESNET Board Analysis Found

- Inconsistency of quality assurance oversight by Rating Providers
- Inconsistency of the way the various software programs allowed variance of raters in inputting data into the program
- Inconsistency of Home Energy Rater candidate testing



# Chapter Two

- Amendments to chapter two require:
  - Rater candidates to take rater training so they can no longer challenge the rater exam
  - All five probationary ratings are conducted with a rating provider and overseen by a candidate field assessor



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# Software

Policies adopted at the 2013 Fall Board meeting

- RESNET incorporate changes to rating software standards that would include:
  - Establish limits on input variables for whole-house ventilations systems and other in the RESNET Standards
  - Determine bounds checks that can be incorporated into software to limit or warn users when input values are beyond reasonable limits
  - Enhance rating software tools to enable flags to be set for internal inconsistencies that should be checked prior to entering a building file into RESNET registry



# Software- More work to do!

- HERS Software Consistency Task Group has been created and includes representatives from all of the software vendors

# Fall 2013 RESNET Board Meeting

Approved the following policies

- RESNET certified Quality Assurance Designees must in the future:
  - Serve as agents of RESNET
  - Have neither a financial interest nor an employee/employer relationship with the entity performing the rating



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# What has changed since then?

- The Registry wasn't being utilized fully for QA report reviews until 2014 because 2013 was the first year of complete data
- Since 2013 there have been drastic improvements in the implementation of RESNET QA standards
- QA Genie is now being used





# Enhancing the Consistency of HERS Index Scores

## Goals for RESNET Quality Assurance

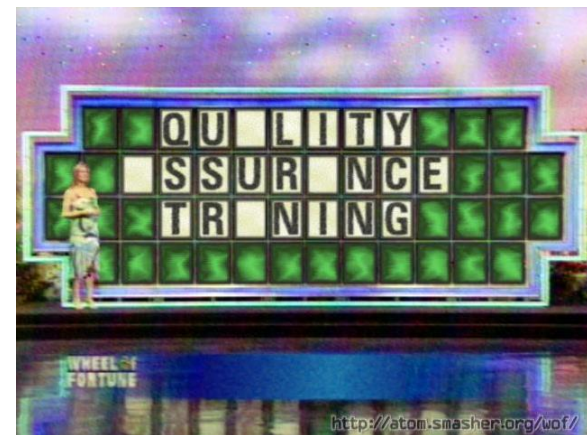
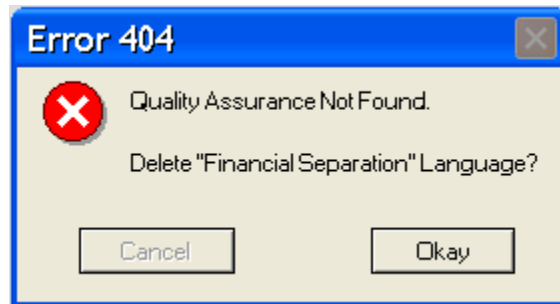
- Consistency in the ratings completed by Raters
- Consistency in Quality Assurance



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# What is the solution?

- Does the proposed solution of financially separating QADs from Providers address the inconsistent QA processes, interpretations, and enforcement of standards?
- Can this be addressed through training of both QADs, Raters and RFIs?



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# Other changes to QA Standards

- Other changes to the QA standards are on hold until a decision can be made by the RESNET Board
- Once a decision has been made other changes may be required before it goes out for public comment again



# RESNET QA Today

We are building our QA Team!

- Scott Doyle joined RESNET in July 2017 as Quality Assurance Manager
- Addition of other RESNET Staff
- Will be adding an Infield QA Specialist in 2018



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# RESNET QA Today

- Improvement in annual QA reports and enforcement of the RESNET QA standards.
- Fewer providers being placed on probation for not meeting the annually required file and field QA review requirements
- Now have the ability to track QA in the Registry

Only 1-in-4 Providers are reached annually

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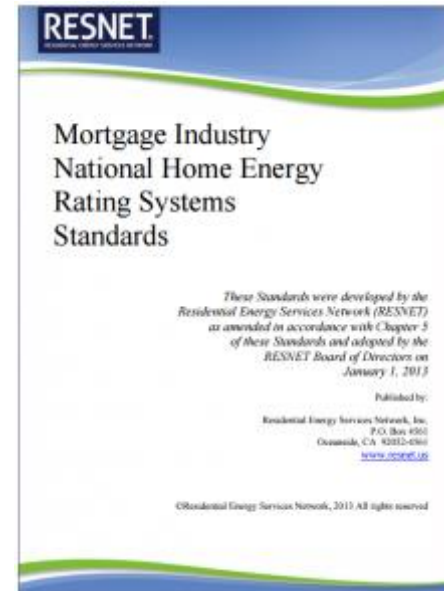
# Future of RESNET QA

- Improvements in Past Several Years
- Still Discovering Inconsistencies
- RESNET needs to have a presence in the field working with QADs and providers



# What do the Standards Say?

Section 902.1 RESNET shall select a minimum of 25% of accredited QA Providers and conduct a more detailed review of their Quality Assurance records.



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# Plans for 2018

50% of Providers and their QADs will have enhanced RESNET QA Annually

- 25% Online Review
- 25% In-Field Review

Introduce the new Field/File QA Checklist

RESNET Field & File Checklist				
* Rating based on percentage of checklist items completed by Rating R: 0) say no with no correct (0) to incorrect, or 2) say yes with a severity score of "1", or 3) the overall rating is a "PASS".				
PASS Pass/Fail Threshold = 91				
Item #	Field / File	Checklist Item	Score	Comments
1*	Field / File	The address is not duplicated in the Registry.		
2*	Field / File	The address is correct and complete for the rated home.		
3*	Field / File	The RatingID matches the RTNREFID.		
4*	Field / File	Climate location is correct for the rated home.		
5*	Field / File	Utility rates are correct and complete for the rated home.		
6*	Field / File	The Rating Date is properly assigned for the rated home.		
7	Field / File	The Rater provided a signed Standard Disclosure Form (when required).		
8	Field / File	All Warning Flags generated by the software were addressed by the Rater.		
9	File	The Sampling Process is correct as required by SIA 1.3.1.1		
10*	Field / File	Required Documentation was provided to support the minimum and features modeled, as defined by RESNET Standards. (e.g. take-offs from plans for proposed ratings or field sketches for existing homes; EnergyGuide labels for appliances; AHERI certificates for HVAC equipment; NFRC or U-factor labels for window performance values, etc.)		
11*	Field / File	The HERI Index is within acceptable variance, as defined by the RESNET Standards.		
12*	Field / File	The number of bedrooms match the site data collected and/or projected specifications.		
13*	Field / File	Number of stories, including basement, match on-site file.		
14	Field / File	The envelope ceiling area is the envelope floor area.		
15	Field / File	The Rater indicated vaulted or sloped ceilings if the envelope ceiling area is > envelope floor area.		
16	Field / File	The average ceiling height if reasonable and/or the site data collected and/or projected specifications. (If or example: Divide the conditioned volume of the home by the envelope floor area.)		
17	Field / File	The above grade wall height is reasonable and close to the average ceiling height. (If or example: Multiply the foundation perimeter by the number of stories. Divide the above grade wall area by that result to get the approximate wall height)		
18	Field / File	The area, type, and insulation match the site data collected and/or projected specifications for flat, vaulted/sloped, and/or energy rated ceilings.		
19	Field / File	The ceiling type of a vaulted or sloped ceiling is reasonable. (Example: If vaulted or sloped ceiling area is unreasonable, subtract flat ceiling from footprint. Divide the sloped/vaulted ceiling area by that result and multiply by 12 to determine the result.)		
20	Field / File	The foundation depth match the site data collected and/or projected specifications.		
21	Field / File	The foundation wall area, type, and exposure match the
